A - Pronounced "ah"	N - Same as in English

C - Pronounced "say"	P - Pronounced "pay"
D - Pronounced "day"	Q - Pronounced "kew"
E - Pronounced	R - Pronounced "eir"
F - Same as in English	S - Same as in English
G - Pronounced "z-jay"	T - Pronounced "tay"
H - Pronounced "ash"	U - Pronounced "oo"
I - Pronounced "ee"	V - Pronounced "vay"
J - Pronounced "z-gee"	W - Pronounced "double vay"
K - Pronounced "ka"	X - Pronounced "ix"
L - Same as in English	Y - Pronounced "i-grec"
M - Same as in English	Z - Pronounced "zed"
